The three Congresses will meet in a combined format, and general themes will be addressed in symposia, workshops, panels, and roundtables. Short presentations will be presented in poster format in virtual spaces, and a day of farm visits will be included to showcase sustainable and resilient technological alternatives using silvopastoral arrangements.

ADMISSION OF WORKS

Conferences:

The Scientific Committee will request keynote speakers from leading specialists in the various topics and workshops. Those interested in contributing to a specific topic can submit a request to the Organizing Committee, which will evaluate the proposal and respond as quickly as possible.

Conference manuscripts should be submitted following the guidelines for full papers, which are presented below.

Complete works:

- The complete work should have a maximum of 5,000 words and 6 to 10 pages, including graphs, tables, images, bibliography, and acknowledgments.
- The presentation language can be Spanish, English or Portuguese.
- The complete work must include a Title, Authors, Abstract (250 words in English), Keywords (in English and Spanish or Portuguese), Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results and Discussion, Conclusions, Acknowledgments (optional), and Bibliography.

General preparation of the complete work:

- The document must include the number of lines and pages.
- Pages must be set to letter size, with a 3 cm left margin and 2.5 cm on the remaining margins.
- The text will be justified on both margins.
- The font should be Times New Roman, font size 12, with single line spacing.

Organization of the complete work:

- Title: In bold, capitalizing only the first letter of the first word; a maximum of three lines. The title must be in Spanish or Portuguese and English. Proper nouns must also have an initial capital letter.
- Authors: Listed after the title, in italics, with the initials of the main names and full last names, separating authors with a semicolon ";". The author's affiliation should then be added in Times New Roman font, listing the authors with numbers, postal address, and email address of the main author or the recipient of correspondence.
- Abstract in English: The abstract should not exceed 250 words and should contain the Objectives, Materials and Methods, Results and Conclusions in a single paragraph.
- Keywords in Spanish or Portuguese and English (Keywords): italics (not bold). Five (5) words maximum, not used in the title.
- Introduction: It will present the problem, the purpose of the research and the reference background that highlights the importance of the work.
- Materials and Methods: Brief description of the materials, methods, techniques, experimental design and statistical methodology used.
- Results and discussion: These can appear together in the same section or separated into two sections. The results achieved (preliminary or expected in the case of projects) will be summarized. These results will be discussed in relation to the question posed in the introduction.
- Conclusions: It will summarize the most relevant points of the work and their implications.
- Acknowledgments (optional): Times New Roman 9 regular (no bold).
- Bibliography: Write in Times New Roman 9 regular font (not bold). The bibliography should be arranged alphabetically and should include all citations used in the text. In-text citations should indicate the author and year of the work, following chronological order, e.g., (Porter et al., 1950; Jones, 1990). Below are some examples of bibliographic citations:

- Table and graph format: Grayscale. Font: Times New Roman 12 for all text. It is suggested that the length of tables and graphs be considered so as not to exceed the maximum length of ten pages. Table legends should be placed at the top and graph legends at the bottom. For optimal presentation, graphs should be in JPG format with a resolution of 300 dpi.
 - Image format: JPG format, with a resolution of 300 dpi. Photos and images must be presented in the text in their corresponding place.

For farmers, their submissions must be limited to a maximum of three pages, including, in addition to the abstract, information on how the work was conducted, the main results, and conclusions. Video submissions with a maximum duration of five minutes are accepted.

All submissions will be accepted by June 15, 2025. Papers submitted after the aforementioned date may be considered for acceptance, but the Organizing Committee cannot guarantee their inclusion in the event's scientific reports.

Submissions must be submitted in accordance with the event's publication guidelines. Submissions will be managed through the event's platform, available on the event's website <https://www.silvopatcuba2025.com> The Scientific Committee will review the papers and decide whether they will be accepted and how they will be presented.
